BCAS meets on the second Monday of every month from September through May at 6:30 p.m. at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, 1607 Baker Court. We serve refreshments, socialize and listen to stimulating and well researched presentations by local and national birding authorities.

Every month we gather for field trips and bird and wildflower hikes; we go on overnight trips in the Florida Panhandle and visit special bird watching regions in neighboring states. We are especially interested in migration routes in the Southeast.


BCAS PROGRAMS 2025-2026

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

In addition to regular monthly meetings, BCAS hosts Nature Connection, a chance to meet and hear nationally known birders, photographers and naturalists. In March we will present **Doug Tallamy** a leading entomologist and well known for advocating the use of native plants to create wildlife habitats in home landscapes, and authoring best-selling books like *Bringing Nature Home* and *Nature's Best Hope*.



Scott Raschid will also come to Panama City in March; the “Owl Man” is a well-known author, artist, bird rehabilitator and winner of the 2025 Champion of Owls award.

In conjunction with Nature Connection the Panama City Center for the Arts will host a juried Art and Photo event, using Immersive Technologies which blend digital and physical realities to create interactive, sensory experiences, of nature related subjects.
